Prez' sez "Temperature/SFI/Meteors All up!"

hat a month November was! Not only were temperatures unseasonably high, but six meters was "red hot", as well. Add in a "once in a lifetime" Leonids meteor shower (with two different generations of space dust), and a lively contest season, and you have a month to remember.

I worked into Europe on 6 meters with about 20 watts to a 40 meter dipole and also got some other DX, including an XE and HC8. The HC8 has been loud every day for a week on both CW and SSB. I worked a couple of dozen W6 and W7s with no problems, also on both modes. This really is a "magic" band! I don't know who out there is competing with Roy (WK4Y) for the coveted CVCC "most band countries" award, but I heard him recently on 6, knocking 'em dead. I also heard a bunch of other CVCC'ers and affiliates on 6, including W4DR, W4MYA, N4CH, N4EHJ, and WA4PGM. Everyone seems to be enjoying the "Indian Summer" and the 2nd peak of this sunspot cycle.

The Leonids Meteor Showers of 11/18/01 were a real visual treat. They weren't nearly as spectacular as advertised (optimists said up to 400+/minute), but they were definitely worth watching. I set my alarm for about 2:30 AM, but my night owl kids saw a few when they came home from a concert and woke me up a bit earlier. We stayed out for an hour or two, then went to bed. I passed on listening to the radio (as I was enjoying some rare quality time with the "adult kids"), but I hope the "ping jockeys" got their fill of new grids.

Contesting has been fun this month, if not great. The SFI took a dive for the CQWW CW and we had a major solar storm on Saturday. The "A" index hit 95 for most of the contest, but the bands did open back up after a few hours. We had a lot of contesters for the CW 'test and that is a good thing. Kyle (WA4PGM) and Steve (NR4M) made a showing from out of town and we appreciate their efforts. Even though the CQWW CW conditions were way down from the CQWW SSB contest, we did a little better with our "benchmark" against W3LPL. In the SSB contest, we had about 51% of 'LPL's score; whereas in the CW contest,



Tony, as that island is about to wash away) on 40, 30, 20 and 10. HKØGU, San Andres was new on 80, 30, 20 and 12. XT2DX on 10 and 20, ZB2FK on 80 and a nice run on 6 with F, G, SP, GW and MMØ. N4ZJ caught one of the hot days on 6 and worked 4Z4UR, SM, F, G, HC8, GW, PA and GM. Tom also scored with ZK2, 3B9, D44 on 17; TJ2 and C91 as well as EZ1NIC and a 3W on 20; HKØ, FG and D44 on 30: A61AR on 80; V63 and YI9OM on 10. W4MYA finally got a 5W on 160 and added a 3A on 12, but Bob's big success was on 6 were he added LZ, YO, YU, FR, 5R8, LA, LX, OH, OHØ, OE, V73, KH2, ER1, 4X, 5B4, OD5, SV1 and 9J2BO to reach 117.

W4YV crawled out of the woodwork and nailed rare HVØA on 6 along with several LZs. N4CH is happy with SP and V73AT for new ones on 6. Although I missed the two best 6 meter days in November I still managed to add 5R8, Z22, LX, OHØ, HB9, LZ and OE and possibly a T7 and HV to bring my total on the magic band to 133. Old friend Jon Rudy is now active as DU9/NØNM on all bands 80 through 6 and he

Fellow PVRC'er, K4ZW is just back from Mongolia where he installed a first class 160/80 vertical for JT1CO. Ken was able to work 483 stations on 160 including W8JI and K9DX. Chak is a great operator and will give us a chance at zone 23 on 80 and 160 in the coming years. The Duce Island DXpedition was wisely cancelled due to dangerous seas in the VP6 area. Just a reminder that next weekend is the ARRL 160 Meter Contest. I added my 160 meter "pigtails" to my 80 meter dipole yesterday. What a nice day it was - who would have believed we would be having 75+ degree days at the end of November? Also, note that the PVRC is recognizing "local" chapters, so there is an incentive to submit a log.

I have worked 48 states on 160 meters with my 100 watts and makeshift horizontal and inverted "L" (still needAlaska and ND). I normally have an inverted "V" for 80 meters. For the 160 meter contests, I add 60+ feet toeach end. On one end I can extend the antenna parallel with the ground and in a straight line. The other end; however, needs to make a right angle turn and the "pigtail" is only a few feet off the ground. Because of the "Indian Summer" I had to get out the hedge cutter and clear out some new growth to keep the "pigtails" clear of the low lying bushes. Anyway, the modified 80 meter antenna loads up FB on 160 meters and I am ready for the "Top Band" contest!




