The SFI hit 283 for a three hour window on 9/26 (sunspots were around 380). The SFI has been over 260 for several days and I am sure this month will be a new high for the current cycle. We have seen "double peaks" before, but not this dramatic. I called "CQ DX ASIA" last night (9/28) on 10 meters CW and had JAs coming back to my 100 watts. I have-

By now a few of you have probably heard of the new mode (FSK441) for meteor scatter called "WSJT" Weak Signal by K1JT. Well this mode has put life back into VHF and MS for most ping jockeys. Although I missed the Perseids shower and a good chance to pick many several new grids, I finally got everything hooked up by the end of August. Within the first couple tries I had worked 2 new grids on random meteors using a small 2 meter setup, the excitement was intense. A VHF buzz if you will, I'm hooked! I have had really good success in the range of 500 to 1000 miles and have heard stations about 1300 miles. Other hams are using WSJT to make contacts on

6/2/222/432 almost everyday and it doesn't take a large setup to start today. The interface is easy to build or inexpensive to buy, the software is free and everyone is welcome to use the Ping Jockey web site to arrange skeds. Check out these web sites for more information about MS and WSJT:




