PVRC 5 Million Award:

This is a nice plaque to win, when you contribute a cumulative 5 million points to the PVRC contesting efforts. Endorsements are available in 5M increments, after the initial award. Check out the PVRC web site for more details. I can assure you that this is an achievable award for any CVCC/PVRC member. If you are active in most (if not all) of the major contests, you can count on up to 3M points per year (that has been my experience, guest operating at W4MYA's for the big contests and operating at home for the SS, etc.). Predictions for this year are for W4MYA to get a 35M endorsement, W4TNX to get a 15M endorsement, W4HJ to get a 10M endorsement, K4JA to get an initial 5M award AND a 10M endorsement. W4HJ, W4HZ, W4DR, WK4Y and WU4G are within a year of the 10M endorsement. N4EHJ is at 3.38M points and needs only one good season to join the group! I may easily have overlooked another candidate and, if so, my apologies!

Manassas Awards - Va. QSO Party:

I accepted the award for the CVCC Club Plaque from SPARC at the Manassas Hamfest (we got an IOU) and thanked the "LARGe" LARG contingent for the competition they gave us! Nice to have some friendly competition and possibly some new Virginia contesters!

Va. QSO Party Club Award - CVCC won and set an all-time record - this was a memorial award for Bill Cox, W4DAA.




