Random Skip by W4DR

On July 15 last summer I worked CO8LY/B on 6 meters. He was operating in grid square FK19. Cuba is a big island and has portions of a good many grid squares, but only two of them are represented by resident stations.

Collecting grid squares on 6 meters is one of my hobbies and since with over 1000 of them confirmed I only work half a dozen or less each summer via E-skip. It is not a burden to attempt to confirm them by any means possible. Since we have not had direct mail service with Cuba for many years, active Cuban stations often have QSL manager in other countries.

CO8LY was no exception. QRZ.com listed his manager as EA7ADH with a request that \$2 be sent for reply postage. Imagine my surprise last week when I received one of my self-addressed envelopes with a Cuban stamp on it. The stamp was 85 (somethings) and bore a postmark for October 20, which meant it took about a month to get here. Perhaps it came via Canada or some other more neutral country, but I saw no evidence of that. Apparently EA7ADH sent my self-addressed envelope to

CO8LY with or without the \$2 rather than posting a card from Spain. I'm still scratching my head over this, but am delighted to have FK19 confirmed. Anyone else have stories about Cuban QSLs?
