TX4T French Polynesia from 9-25 Feb. International team focusing on 80-160 and WPX RTTY and ARRL DX CW Contests.

V88 Brunei from 22 Feb - Mar 3. One man German operation.

VK9X Christmas Is. From 20-27 Feb. British CW only team G3SWH & G3RTE.

9U1VO Burundi from 22 Feb – Mar 6. German team using 100W and verticals.
