Random Skip by W4DR

December is usually one of the really good months for low band DX, but this year so far has been a bust. The recent 160 meter reflector carried a blurb by RA4LW about his working and confirming all 50 states on 160 SSB. He even posted a photo of the 50 cards. Guess who was the Virginia QSO/QSL?

Vlad worked almost all of the states during December of 2009. Those who read this column may remember that it was in December 09 that I finally worked Mongolia in Zone 23 on 160. It was a magic month. Perhaps the rising solar activity has spoiled the magic this season.

December marked the passing of two amateurs who were important to DX in general and me personally. Joe Galeski, W4IMP, was the founder of Galeski Optical and a well known business man in the Richmond area. What is less well known is that in the late 1950's he was a pioneer on SSB. Joe was important in bringing about the transformation of AM to SSB as the mode for phone DX'ing. He built a light, small 100 watt 20 meter transmitter and sent it as a loaner to various rare and semirare DX locations to put them on the air for the first time. He also published a QST article on the rig called

"The IMP". Joe and his friend, W4IYC were the ones who loaned me the equipment to get on SSB. Joe was for many years the trustee of W4ZA the club call of the RARC. RIP, Joe.

The second loss was Ahamed, HZ1HZ. He was the father of amateur radio in Saudi Arabia much as YK1AA was in Syria. Ahamed was licensed in 1949 and has been active on the bands ever since then. He was the Deputy Minister of the PTT for many years and represented Saudi Arabia at the ITU Conferences since 1956. For me he was my 100th DXCC entity and I still treasure his QSL with the words across the front, "Mecca, the holy city prohibited to non-Muslims".

Two other personal items. I recently received a notification that INDEXA was awarding honorary life membership to DX Hall of Fame members, an unexpected honor. INDEXA was one of the foundations who supported our YK9A dxpedition in 2001. These foundations which include NCDXF and the Yasme Foundation are very valuable resources in making the really rare DX locations available to the DX fraternity. They deserve our support. You may also remember me mentioning my friend, Tony, W2VRK. He sent me a rare VO2 QSL which was one of the 10 deleted countries I had not worked. Recently he sent me a 1950 W4QCW QSL, which I had sent to a W1. It was a beautiful card with a 1 cent stamp on it. W1 was the best DX I worked on 160 before I came back on the band in 1969. About a week ago I got another gift from Tony, a PK6DA qsl. This reduces to 4 the number of "entities" I need cards from to have a complete collection of all 400 postwar DXCC entities. They are FI, FN, CR8/D and PK5. Tony tells me these cards are extremely rare and bring big bucks on E-bay. I may have to settle for 396 out of 400.

Thanks for joining me in another trip down memory lane. May 2011 create some new DX memories for you to share with younger amateurs. And if you think DX'ing is dying out read the recent ARRL news item about the large increase in QSL bureau activity (ingoing and outgoing) and in the DXCC applications and endorsements. They are way up from 2009.
