Random Skip by W4DR

Recently the argument has been renewed whether sun spots affect the low bands, especially 160, or not. There is no question that 20 meters and up are greatly affected by the state of the sun. I believe recent log records of some of the best equipped and most active 160 DX'ers prove the point that the solar flux has a dramatic effect on the difficult polar paths on 160. My own experience seems to confirm their observations. We have just gone through one of the longest quiet sun periods in recent history and 2009 fell in the middle of this period. 2009 was a most unusual year. During the winter months I would hear Zone 17, 18 and 19 stations both morning and evening on a almost daily basis. Prior to this a good year may produce 3 or 4 such qsos and those only after I put up my 4 square array for 160. You may recall that it was finally the year when I made a Zone 23 qso on top band. Prior to or since the winter of 09 I have not even heard anyone in Zone 23. These qsos were all made via direct path over the north pole. Before and since 09 I notice that on the rare occasion that I can hear or work anyone in deep Asia on 160 it has been via long path as opposed to direct path. Of course the long path signals are much weaker than those via direct path. As the city and suburbia have moved ever closer to me those long path signals tend to be covered by man-made noise which leads me to:

The need for a new challenge. Maybe it is time to forget about 160. The ARRL has just announced a new program, the ARRL Diamond DXCC Challenge. 2012 is the 75th anniversary of the beginning of the DXCC program. The new challenge is to see how many of the countries on the original list of 231 you can work during 2012. A list has been published that gives the present prefixes for the old DXCC countries. For example French Indochina credit can be obtained by working any one of XU, XV or XW. On the other hand Indonesia is once again four countries so you need to pay attention to the YB number suffixes. The beauty of this award is that it is not band, power or mode endorsed and no qsls are required. The ARRL does check the validity of the contacts you claim. The award is given for 100 countries and then endorsed in 25 increments up to 225. A Honor Roll will be published online showing who is making the most rapid progress and then in February 2013 QST with the final results. This sounds like great fun and I suspect will stimulate some DXpeditions to cities and territories which have separate status, but which aren't of special interest to the current DXCC program. For example Goa State in India is a country. On the other hand some of our super rare present entities like Navassa Island are not on the list. Perhaps we should make this a challenge within a challenge by seeing who in the CVCC can make the highest score. What do you think? Bob W4DR
