60 Meter Changes

The new changes to the FCC regulations for Amateur use of the 60 meter band go into effect on March 5th 2012. Power output is increased from 50W ERP to 100W ERP. Channel 3 frequency has been changed and CW and PSK 31 will become allowed modes in addition to USB. Remember we are secondary users on these frequencies!



These are the channel center frequencies. Make sure your transceiver actually transmits CW on the dial frequency. Some older ones shifted the transmit signal above or below the dial frequency. If you are not sure, contact the manufacturer of your rig and/or use your frequency counter.
